WRITING YOUR AUTOBIOGRAPHY

What Exactly IS an Autobiography?

The main reason for writing an autobiography is to tell the reader about yourself in a positive way. You are advertising yourself. Your autobiography can be used as a tool to promote yourself and open doors to your future. Worried you won't be able to express yourself well? Not to worry, the following pages will make the writing of an autobiography a simple task.

Why am I writing this now?

The autobiography is an important assignment that will make up 10% of your final grade. Your autobiography will be uploaded to the website of the school which people will be able to see. You will be able to use your autobiography in the future when applying for a job. You will be taught how to continually update your autobiography to keep it fresh.

I Don't Know What To Write About. Sure you do, you just need to start asking yourself what makes you an important or interesting person. What makes you stand out. You can write the autobiography in a way that reflects your personality. Be true to yourself and the writing will be easier. Every autobiography is different because people are different. Make your autobiography special.

One person can have many different autobiographies that serve different functions. The reasons will guide its content. For this assignment you need to determine what goal the autobiography is supposed to serve. Perhaps you thought this: I want people to know more about me. Well, it's a start but it's not specific enough. Here is some help.

You are a student of Da Yeh University in your senior year about to graduate. Therefore the goal for this autobiography assignment is to write an autobiography that describes the excellence of your academic career telling the reader all you have accomplished at Da Yeh University.

Contents should include your:

- Life philosophy with quotation
- Life goals and why
- Experiences
- Major and how it relates to your future plans
- Likes and Dislikes
- Campus social life
- Awards, Special Tests, Proficiency Tests, Certifications, Research Papers
- Special Knowledge and how it was acquired (reference a mentor or special teacher)
- What you want to happen next in life.

Let's decide our Audience.

The person reading it will be the audience. It's important to list the people who you want to read your autobiography in your mind while you're writing. Your audience can be more than one person, company or school. Imagine them in front of you. It should read as if you are speaking directly to them. If you want different people to know different things then more than one autobiography is needed. Write down now who you want to read your autobiography.

Punctuation and Grammar Notes.

Indent paragraphs.

Use quotes for quotations. "..."

Write short sentences.

Use simple past for items using dates.

Use present perfect for items with no dates.

Ex. I took the test last year.

Ex. I have taken the XXX test.

General Structure

Paragraph 1

Introduce yourself and your belief system. It should be very positive. Write about your belief system in a way where the reader immediately things WOW! GREAT!

Paragraph 2

Continue the positive flow by introducing your school. Talk about what you studied and HOW MUCH YOU ENJOYED IT! Make it sound like your academic time was special and explain why. Always explain why. Be specific. Write about the details of your academic career so the reader will know what knowledge you gained from your time at university.

Paragraph 3

You think you're smart. Of course you do but you need to prove it to others. Write in a way that proves you're smart. Talk about your scores: GPA, TOEIC, AMC Exam, LCCI, TBSA, etc.

Paragraph 4

Start winding down. Now that you've proved yourself you can talk about something lighter. Tell more about the person behind the good grades. Talk about your likes and dislikes, hobbies and activities. What do you do in your free time for fun? Write about what you do in a way that the reader will still think WOW! Remember to be positive.

More Paragraphs

Do you want to write more? GREAT! More. More. More. Do you want to write about something not listed here? As long as it makes you look good you may add more information. Have a friend or mentor read it to see if it reads as good to them as it does to you.

Final Paragraph

Wrap it up. You are closing a life chapter and starting another. This is a good time to talk about the next step in your life plan. What's next for you? Go into the future a little bit then come back to the present. You can summarize this special time you have had at the university. If the autobiography is formal you may thank the reader for their attention. If less formal you may end with a catchy phrase. "I'll never forget Da Yeh" for example.

Watch Out For Traps!

Stay away from negative sounding words or sentences.

NO

I am not very good at English.

YES

I enjoy practicing English as I would like to improve my ability.

Why? Don't say you're not good at something. Say you like practicing and want to get better.

NO

I like to play games with my friends in my free time.

YES

I enjoy spending time with other people strategizing how to solve problems.

Why? Playing games sounds lazy, working on problems socially sounds better.

NO

I am a shy person so I spend a lot of time reading books and studying for classes.

YES

I feel I can never have enough knowledge so I spend a lot of time reading and studying for classes.

Why? Shy is a negative sounding word. Delete it. Don't give out too much information.

What might sound good to you might not sound good to others.

NO

I spend a lot of time playing with my friends.

YES

I like spending time with people. At school I was involved in many team projects.

Why? Shows you can get along with other people

NO

I like to play computer games in my free time.

YES

I enjoy working on my computer in my free time.

Why? Don't let others think you will only play on computers.

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NO

I desire a comfortable life. It's almost impossible for me to go after fame or wealth.

YES

I desire a stable work environment where I can support my boss.

Why? Comfortable, no desire for wealth: sounds lazy.

Too Little Information

Badminton is fun.

AND??????

Too Much Information

I think badminton is fun and good exercise so I joined the badminton team. I like it because I get to be part of a team and spend time with my friends. I think I am good though I am not the best player on the team. That is my friend Katie. She is really good. We played against many different schools and had a lot of fun meeting students from other universities. I really hoped that we would win the championship but we did not. We just came in third. I still think third is a good. I am proud of our accomplishment.

Why? WHO CARES! The subject is you. Stay on the subject.

Don't make run-on sentences

It is easy when writing a good deal of information about the same subject to make your sentences too long.

NO

I took the TOEIC test six months ago and got a score of 840 for listening and reading but I have also taken the TOEIC speaking and writing and got a score of 400 plus I have taken the IELTS exam with a score of 7 in addition to possessing the Microsoft Office Specialist Certification and also the TBSA Certificate of Business Planning Proficiency, from Taiwan Business Strategy Association.

Break it up into small sentences. If the information is really long make a table. Don't make a numbered list as it may look sloppy.

Six months ago I took the TOEIC Test. I scored 840 for listening and reading. I also took the TOEIC Speaking and Writing Test. I scored 400. I have taken the IELTS exam. I scored a 7. I plan on taking the test again in three months. I possess the Microsoft Office Specialist Certification. I also was awarded the TBSA Certificate of Business Planning Proficiency given by the Taiwan Business Strategy Association.

I have taken many tests during my four years of university. My test names and scores are as follows:

GET A FRIEND TO CHECK YOUR WORK FOR MISTAKES!

You can sound very positive but a messy paper full of mistakes will make you look bad.

Make suggestions how it could be improved. **What rules did the writer not follow? How can sentences be changed? What can be added?** Prepare to discuss your answers with the class.
